

Spring Classes 2020

CH100—Church History

A study of Christianity in the course of its development from the apostles through the end of the church age. Special emphasis is given to a biblical definition of events, persons, decisions, and developments.

TH120 - Typology (8wks)

A study of the methods used in the typical method of bible study to develop doctrinal truths found in the Old Testament that are a foreshadow of yet future aspects of the New Testament.

TH130 - Bible Doctrine (8 wks)

A study of the various doctrinal teachings of the Bible. Special attention is given to a study of the seven mysteries, baptisms, judgments, resurrections, etc. including the Seven Seven's, the doctrinal applications of the sacrifices, the feasts; law and grace, spiritual gifts, the resurrections.

NT145—Hebrews

To increase the student's comprehension of the Bachelors content of the book of Hebrews and James in order to see the relationship that exists in the ideas, concepts and theology of the book as it relates to the other New Testament books.

NT125—Romans

A systematic study of the Book of Romans as a starting point for all Christian doctrine. Special emphasis is placed on laying a solid foundation for Christian life and ministry.

School Structure

Classes meet three days per week, August through June, at Heartland Baptist Fellowship. Each of the four years is divided into two semesters. Class times consist of four 90-minute sessions between 7:30am and 10:45pm on Saturday as well as 6:30pm to 8:00pm on Tuesday and Thursday.

Graduation requirements, in addition to passing grades in all classes, include a mission or discipleship trip, pastor evaluation, dissertation, special projects as assigned throughout the four-year course of study, and service team participation as directed. A Certificate of Biblical Studies is awarded when all requirements have been fulfilled.
